3. **Economic Contributions**: Immigrants own 20% of businesses in the U.S., are crucial in creating and expanding the tech industry, and significantly contribute to sectors like healthcare; 28% of physicians and 16% of nurses are immigrants.
4. **Cultural Influence**: The influences of immigrants are evident in American food, music, literature, and popular culture. They have introduced diverse cuisines and greatly impacted the music scene, particularly in genres like hip-hop.
5. **Political Landscape**: Immigration has reshaped party coalitions, with rising numbers of ethnic and racial minority voters contributing to the Democratic Party, while non-college educated whites have increasingly aligned with the Republican Party.
6. **Integration and Change**: Immigrants adapt and reshape their communities, creating new cultural dynamics and challenges, while also contributing to shifts in societal norms and practices.
