This video discusses the issue of racism, particularly in the context of football, where it is prevalent in venues like stadiums, especially in Italy. It highlights a recent incident involving an AC Milan player who was booed by fans, prompting discussions about racism in sports.

The speaker explores whether racism impacts player performance, using the unique situation presented by the COVID-19 pandemic, which allowed them to study player performance in the absence of fans—a natural experiment. With the shutdown of stadiums during the pandemic, the study compares player performance before and after this period, specifically analyzing African players—who often face racial harassment—against other players.

The findings revealed that African players performed better without the presence of fans, suggesting that racist behaviors negatively affect their performance when fans are present. The analysis also considered other factors such as nationality and skin color, establishing a methodological approach to evaluate performance impacts due to racism.

The discussion addresses the broader implications of these findings, suggesting the need for stronger measures against racist behavior in sports, advocating for timely and severe consequences for misconduct by fans to improve not only the experience for players but also the quality of the game itself.
