The research included fieldwork, interviews, and participation in relevant events across various countries, enabling an examination of both conservative and progressive movements regarding LGBT rights. They argue that the opposition to LGBT rights is increasingly being mobilized within transnational platforms, discussing legislation, public policy, and the strategic framing used to undermine rights, such as anti-LGBT propaganda laws. The importance of local civil societies and their unique responses to these challenges is highlighted, suggesting that effective activism must be context-sensitive and take local dynamics into account.
