The research reveals that a considerable percentage of members from these subcultures identify as bisexual, challenging traditional norms that often overlook bisexuality in LGBTQ+ studies. The authors coin the term "perverts" for these groups, intending to reclaim the term from a negative connotation, thereby fostering a sense of empowerment among their members.

Importantly, the authors argue that sensationalist views of these communities misrepresent their desires and aspirations, emphasizing their normality and humanity. This video video posits that all communities, regardless of sexual orientation, share common goals of love, acceptance, and respect, and stresses the potential for these sexual minorities to mobilize politically and achieve rights akin to those gained by the gay community.

Ultimately, the authors aspire to bridge understanding, acceptance, and equality for non-traditional sexual minorities, arguing that acknowledging their rights represents a new civil rights movement poised to expand the definition of marriage and personal autonomy in the future.
