The band has stabilized its four-piece lineup since 2017 and has been successful in the metal scene. Tatiana is recognized for her exceptional vocal abilities, showcasing a range of harsh growls, screams, and clean singing, often interplaying these styles effectively. Her lyricism addresses significant social and cultural themes, particularly regarding gender paradigms within metal music.

This video explores how genre conventions in metal typically emphasize male perspectives and often marginalize female representation. It highlights the small percentage of female musicians in metal and critiques the industry's lack of inclusivity and diversity. The author, who is conducting research on female vocalists in metal, aims to analyze how these artists navigate and transform imposed gender norms.

The discussion includes an analysis of gender representation in music videos and lyrics, revealing that female artists often counter traditional portrayals of femininity in metal. This video mentions specific songs by Ginger that challenge gendered themes, using examples to illustrate how Tatiana's performance and musical style embody alternative representations of femininity.

The overall research aims to deconstruct the masculine ideologies prevalent in metal while showcasing the diverse voices of female artists. It asserts that women in metal can express a full range of emotions—strength, vulnerability, and aggression—thereby complicating societal assumptions surrounding male and female expressions in the genre. The study ultimately seeks to broaden understanding of the implications of female artists' participation in metal music and highlight their significant contributions to its evolution.
