They note the ongoing need for governance that fosters equitable wealth distribution and sustainable practices, advocating for a holistic approach to change that aligns with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). Finally, they conclude that nurturing socially conscious leadership through education and policy is essential for achieving a better societal future.
